USSVI also endeavors to educate all third parties it comes in contact with about the services United States submariners performed and how the sacrifices of lost shipmates made possible the freedom and lifestyle Americans enjoy today.

Base Treasurer Raymond Zieverink reported that Jack Jeffries received a check from a recently deceased former submariner's estate who's Last Will & Testament specified that \$100 go to a submarine veteran's organization.

Through the executor's online search, our Carolina-Piedmont base was discovered listed under the USSVI website and since Jack Jeffries was listed as our base contact person, Jack received a check made out to the Carolina-Piedmont Base for \$100.

Further research by Jack discovered that the deceased submariner was actually a former member of the Nat Greene Base.

Discussion was made that this check should belong to the Nat Greene Base.

A motion was made and seconded that a replacement check for the amount \$100 be sent to the Nat Greene Base along with a letter explaining the circumstances behind this check. All agreed and the motion carried.

From The COB—Joel Sparnon MM2(SS)



I want to start this month's article by expressing my heart-felt appreciation for all the kind words and condolence over the last month in regards to the loss of my father. My Dad was a huge influence on my life and who I am as an adult and I will greatly miss him. I am sure that most of you can relate.

Following last month's article showing the USSVI memorial in Louisville, KY, I was reminded of another work trip where I came across a unique Submarine memorial that had a connection to me. I qualified on the USS Pargo (SSN650) and, as has happened to all the 637 class boats, she has been "recycled" (the NAVY's way of saying that she was cut up and shipped off to become razor

blades.)

During a 2013 business trip to Seattle, I came across a large work of art entitled "The Fin Project," by John Young, while visiting a Seattle city park. The park is called Warren G Magnuson Park and is located along the shores of Lake Washington. What Mr. Young has done is take the fairwater planes off of fast attack submarines (being recycled) and created a design that resembles a pod of killer whales.

The project in Seattle was completed in 1998. The boats that had donated the fins were Seahorse SSN 669, Simon Bolivar SSBN 641, Puffer SSN 652, Gato SSN 615, John Adams SSBN 620, Plunger SSN 595, Whale SSN 638, Bergall SSN 667, Flying Fish SSN 673, Tullibee SSN 597, Pargo SSN 650, and Gurnard SSN 662.

Then, in 2003, Mr. Young created a similar design using fairwater planes. He completed this for the City of Miami, and is displayed at the Pelican Harbor Park in the City of Miami, FL. This design resembles a group of Dolphins and the fins are painted grey. The boats that had donated the fins were Sea Devil SSN 664, Pogy SSN 647, Sand Lance SSN 660, Pintado SSN 672, Trepang SSN 674, Billfish SSN

676, Archerfish SSN 678, Tunny SSN 682, Von Steuben SSBN 632, Sculpin SSN 590, Cavalla SSN 684.I have not yet been to the Miami Park, but plan to attend during my next visit to southern Florida.

For as much as we are Veterans to the service of Our Country, we must be Veterans to the service of Gods Army! Amen!




