Perpetual remembrance

Section 3: The organization engages in various projects and deeds that bring about the perpetual remembrance of those shipmates who have given the supreme sacrifice. USSVI also endeavors to educate all third parties it comes in contact with about the services United States submariners performed and how the sacrifices of lost shipmates made possible the freedom and lifestyle Americans enjoy today.

The young boy was a Boy Scout then and made it his Eagle Scout project to get the book back into print. The boy was successful in 1999 in accomplishing his goal.

New life has come into this devotional which is now being redistributed to members of the armed forces, as well as first responders, fire fighters, law enforcement officers and other community servants.

The old saying the older you get the faster time goes resonates in my mind......it's December already and in 16 short days we will ring in a New Year! But before we go there let's slow things down just a little, because the most important pending day is December 25th, the day we recognize the birth of our Sayior, Jesus Christ!

I personally do a Bible read everyday, Monday through Friday I read at least one Chapter of what ever Book of the Bible I happen to be reading through, then a commitment I made with the Lord soon to be two years ago is, what ever Book of the Bible He leads me to, I read as a Devotional every Saturday from the first Saturday of the year to the last Saturday of the year.....yes, I read the same Book of the Bible 52 times, and each and every time I read it, it has something new to offer me in improving my walk




