Sections of the USSVI Creed

Creed:

Section 1: To perpetuate the memory of our shipmates who gave their lives in the pursuit of their duties while serving their country. That their dedication, deeds and supreme sacrifice be a constant source of motivation toward greater accomplishments. Pledge loyalty and patriotism to the United States of America and its Constitution.

Camaraderie:

Section 2: In addition to perpetuating the memory of departed shipmates, USSVI provides a way for all Submariners to gather for mutual benefit and enjoyment. The common heritage as Submariners is strengthened by camaraderie. USSVI supports a strong United States Submarine Force.

Perpetual Remembrance:

Section 3: The organization engages in various projects and deeds that bring about the perpetual remembrance of those shipmates who have given the supreme sacrifice. USSVI also endeavors to educate all third parties it comes in contact with about the services United States submariners performed and how the sacrifices of lost shipmates made possible the freedom and lifestyle Americans enjoy today.

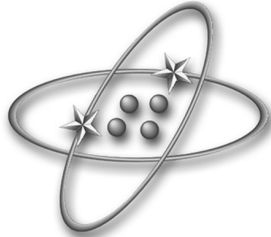

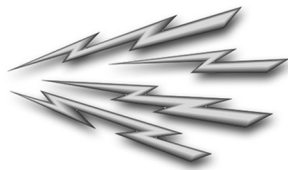

From The COB—Joel Sparnon MM2(SS)

. This month I am going to take a break from my reviews of multiple Submarine veterans memorials that I visit during my travels. Mostly I have not seen any new ones lately. And with the heat we are expecting this summer I wanted to pass along some recommendations on staying hydrated.

As the summer heat comes along it is important to stay hydrated, here are some recommendations to stay hydrated.

Drink enough water to prevent thirst.

Monitor fluid loss by checking the color of your urine. It should be pale yellow and not dark yellow, too smelly or cloudy.

For short-duration (less than 60 minutes), low-to-moderate-intensity activity, water is a good choice to drink before, during and after exercise.

Chief of the Base

Any time you exercise in extreme heat or for more than one hour, supplement water with a sports drink that contains electrolytes (Gatorade / Power aid etc.) and 6 percent to 8 percent carbohydrates. This prevents "hyponatremia" (low blood sodium), which dilutes your blood and could also lead to serious impairment and death.

Begin exercise well-hydrated. Drink plenty of fluids the day before and within the hour before, during and after your exercise session.

Avoid alcohol the day before or the day of a long exercise bout, and avoid exercising with a hangover. Really don't drink alcohol on really hot days that you are going to physically exert yourself.

Eat at least five cups of fruits and vegetables per day for optimum health, as they all contain various levels of water and the all-important nutrient potassium. (bananas are high in Potassium)

You can also replace fluid and sodium losses with watery foods that contain salt and potassium, such as soup and vegetable juices.

For long hikes, when you'll need food, dried fruit and nut mixtures contain high amounts of potassium, sodium, protein, carbs and calories — though continue to

drink plenty of water.

Insurance Update – Bases may be charged \$25 for covering USSVI insurance premiums

Voting dates changed from 90 days down to 60 days prior to the Annual Business Meeting to conform wit the Corporation Laws of the State of Connecticut (that is where USSVI is incorporated).

The recent BOD Mid-Term Meeting was held in Orlando Florida at a superb facility (the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort). The 2017 National Convention will also be held there in Orlando (August 31 thru September 5).

Consideration is strongly being given to having the 2018 National Convention onboard a cruise ship out of Ft. Lauderdale.

The Benediction followed this special presentation and was given by Chaplain Hulme.

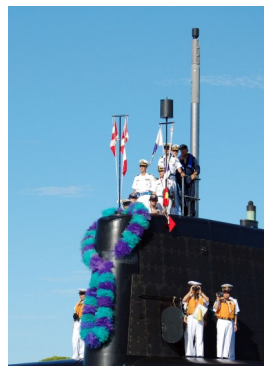
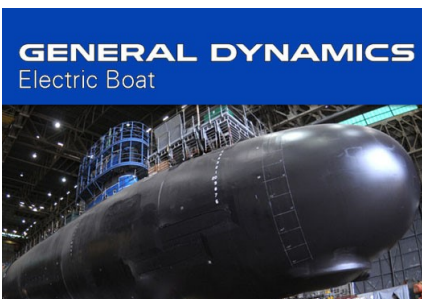

It is pot luck, and everyone that attends the dinner should contribute something, whether home-made or store-bought.

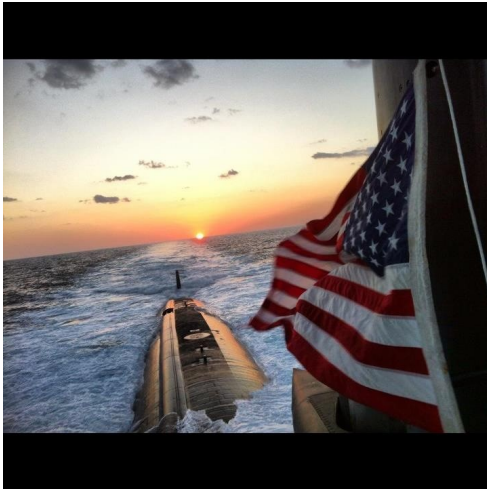

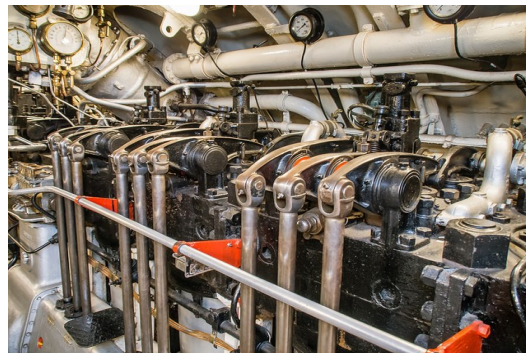

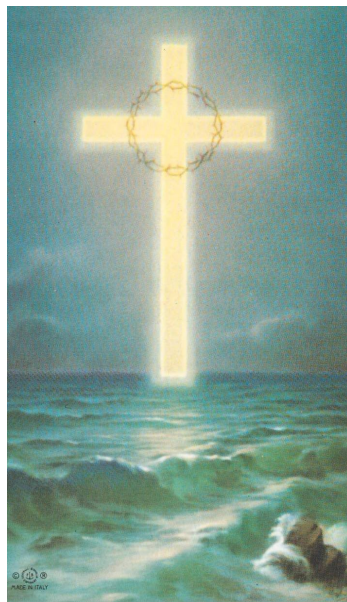
