ELIGIBILITY:

US SUBMARINE VETERANS WWII - Restricted to officers and enlisted men of US Navy Submarine Crews and Relief Crews, who were on active duty between December 7, 1941 and December 31, 1946. **Associate Membership** may be issued to ANY person by vote of the chapter or State Commander. NO NATIONAL DUES SHALL BE ASSESSED. Must pay \$10.00 yearly base dues. He may subscribe to national publications at the \$10 prescribed rate. Associate members cannot vote on any level higher than the local chapter nor hold any office higher than the local chapter.

WIVES OF SUBMARINE VETERANS WWII - RESTRICTED TO wives or unmarried widows of men eligible for membership. WIDOWS MAY RECEIVE THE POLARIS FREE OF CHARGE BY LETTING THE COMMANDER KNOW OF YOUR INTEREST. TO RECEIVE THE ALL CLEAR, CONTACT THE EDITOR.

Organized to perpetuate the memory of those shipmates who gave their lives in submarine warfare, to further promote and keep alive the spirit and the unity that existed among crewmen during WWII, to promote sociability, general welfare and good fellowship among its members, to pledge loyalty and patriotism to the United States of America.




WWII US NAVY BOMB TRAILER UPDATE

OUR "SENIOREST" ON ETERNAL PATROL

We U.S. Submarine Veterans of North Carolina lost our "seniorest" member on March 17, St. Patrick's Day. That was the day that 96-year-old Lin (Gunner) Respess chose to cast off lines from dockside in Greenville, NC for his eternal patrol. If there was anything green about Gunner, it was caused by being underwater for so long aboard the 10 submarines he served aboard during his nearly 25 years in the Silent Service.

None of us miss Gunner more or knew him better than Al Bremer, who served with Gunner aboard USS REQUIN. As Chief of the Boat (COB), Gunner helped motivate Al to complete his "quals" in near record time and Al, in turn, spent valuable time visiting with Gunner during the latter's final days in port. Our wish is that we had known Gunner better, if not merely to benefit from hearing the sea stories that emerged from his years of service to his country.

Gunner joined the Navy in 1934. The next year, he qualified aboard the venerable S-21. The outbreak of World War II found him aboard SEARAVEN: although only a GM1, he was named COB, with promotion to GMC following soon. He remained aboard SEARAVEN for her 10 war patrols, followed by his 11th war patrol aboard SEA FOX. Other boats that served as homes away from home for Gunner were S-23, S-24, SEALION, TIGRONE, CONGER, and ODAX.

To use an old Navy expression, we imagine that Gunner has probably wrung more water from his socks than many of us have sailed through.

And while we're on the subject of our Senior Submariner, let's not forget that several other NC Subvets are close to Gunner in seniority. Minutes from the NC Subvets Working Meeting Held at VFW Post #7383 in Cary, NC April 4, 2009

Pledge of Allegiance was recited by the 36 Subvets in attendance. All present introduced themselves with info on the boats and duty stations where they served during their naval careers.

HOLLAND CLUB PRESENTATIONS:

Pat Collins presented Holland Club plaques, lapel pins, and challenge coins to 2 Subvets: Jim Davis and Dick Gudis.





SPECIAL GUEST:

All welcomed Tarheel Base charter member Mike Burkholder who was "visiting" from Ft. Wayne, IN. Mike showed members a slide presentation that covered the history of the parade submarine, MK-14 torpedo, and the "grey ghost" bus. Mike donated these presentations to the Tarheel Base.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS ITEMS AND REPORTS:

- 1. Base Secretary Bill Lowe read the minutes of the last working meeting held at the VFW "hut" in Cary on 31 January 2009. Minutes were approved as read.
- Base Treasurer Mike Toomey reported a checkbook balance of \$3,150.19 as of 31 March 2009. Current Tarheel Base membership stands at 193 after dropping 8 Subvets for nonpayment of dues. Motion was made and passed to supply Pat Collins \$108.00 to purchase 24 challenge coins for Holland Club inductees.
- 3. Chuck Jensen stated the placement of an S-28 plaque in the WWII Museum of the Pacific in Fredricksburg, TX is on hold for now. This item remains open.

- 4. Chuck Jensen reported on the status of the Burnsville Memorial. Joe Peek has recently visited the memorial and said the site made it through the winter with no further damage. The owner of the property is still in financial trouble due the market downturn and hope is that he will still be able to pay half of the \$4,300 restoration cost in the future. Joe Peek will make a donation \$850 to the project in memory of his father. To date, a total of \$527 is in the Carolina-Piedmont Base treasury for the Burnsville Memorial Restoration Fund. A bucket was passed around during the meeting and \$126 was collected for this restoration project. This item remains open.
- 5. All Clear editor Jerry "Patch" Paciorek will continue with the same format for the next addition. Patch announced the deadline for submission of articles is Monday, 6 April 2009.
- 6. Jim Myers covered obtaining a waiver form in lieu of insurance for the parade torpedo trailer. Mike Hubbell will contact Admiral Steve Glass, a former JAG officer, and solicit his help in drafting the waiver form. Last year, we built a huge playground for a small low-income housing community joining forces with volunteers from the neighborhood and greater Wilmington area, every one of these projects (and ours was just one of many) are great causes, and the more the merrier. We'd love to see our Tarheel brothers and sisters while we're down there, so I hope some of you can make it to Wilmington and catch up with us.

The boat is in a Post Shakedown Availability right now, and for those rusty on their NavSpeak, that means about fourteen to sixteen months of intensive shipyard upgrades. How can we be getting upgraded already you may ask? Well, it all has to do with contractual obligations and the latest technology at the time of that contract. (Anyone remember brand new 688s being commissioned with stored energy systems just to have them ripped out months later?...) We're being outfitted with the absolute newest (it's still being DEVELOPED as we speak) SONAR, Fire Control, and Radio Room. We're having all of our MILES of fiber optic cable upgraded to what's called "Blown Fiber" which can handle much larger volumes of information, at a much faster rate. We're having much of our hull covering replaced and upgraded, and all of our Power Conversion Modules (PCMs) are being upgraded. PCMs take the place of MG sets, inverters, transformers, etc. They do all our DC to AC, AC to DC, step-up, step-down (and anything else you can think of) conversions. They're all solid state and computer controlled, I think PCM really stands for Pure Computer Magic, because they're pretty amazing gizmoes... Those are really just the biggest projects, there's thousands more, and you'll be proud to note: Our ship, your namesake state boat, will be the most technologically advanced and tactically capable submarine in the world, and that's no mean feat with some of the gee-whiz gadgets out there. EB, the Department of the Navy, and the Submarine Force has really decided to take a (pardon my French) bad-ass boat, and make it even badder.

We hope some day we can make the windy trip up the Cape Fear river again, but in the mean time, we'd love to (once we're out of the shipyard) have y'all visit sometime, and tell tall tales, tip back a few, and wait ten minutes for the New England weather to change its mind.

TRICARE USER FEE UPDATE 33

Following is a letter sent by Sen. Joseph I. Lieberman to a member of FRA Branch 20 in Groton, CT in response to his query on the rumored Tricare For Life budget cuts. It is self-explanatory and should be widely disseminated in the military community:

February 19, 2009

Dear Mr. Serabian:

Thank you for contacting me regarding rumored cuts in benefit programs for military retirees, including TRICARE for Life. Currently, a wealth of false and misleading information is being distributed on this matter; and I welcome the opportunity to explain the source of the confusion.

I am aware of several chain emails, online discussion boards, blogs, and even articles in well-intentioned veterans' publications that imply that President Obama and Congress plan on eliminating TRICARE for Life. The insinuations put forth by these sources are false.

The source of these stories is a report issued by the Congressional Budget Office (CBO), entitled Budget Options Volume 1: Heath Care, released in December 2008. Before jumping to conclusions about the report itself, however, it is important to know exactly what the CBO is. CBO is a nonpartisan federal agency, tasked with providing Congress with cost estimates for the many legislative proposals considered each year. It also periodically offers Congress suggestions for adjusting federal spending. CBO is an information gathering body for Members of Congress. Its recommendations about the budget are completely non binding; and its officers do not draft actual policy, legislation, or law.

The Budget Options report in question offers a total of 115 options for reducing (or, in some cases, increasing) federal spending on health care, only three of which relate to TRICARE. These options are merely suggestions, not policy statements or actual legislation. Reports such as this one are routine, and very few options or recommendations made by CBO are typically acted upon. President Obama has not indicated support for the three recommendations in this report related to TRICARE, nor has any Member of Congress, to the best of my knowledge. Any suggestion that the Administration is affiliated with this report ignores the fact that it was drafted by the CBO - which, again, is an advisory body of the legislative branch, not the executive branch.

You may also be interested to know that both the Reserve Officers Association (ROA) and the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) have issued statements condemning the aforementioned rumors that are being perpetuated through these chain emails.

I hope that you have found this letter informative, and I encourage you to share this information with members of your community who are concerned about issues relating to military retirees. As a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, please be assured of my continued commitment to protecting the various interests of all those who have fought tirelessly to protect our cherished freedoms.

Thank you again for sharing your views and concerns with me. I hope you will continue to visit my website at http://lieberman.senate.gov for updated news about my work on behalf of Connecticut and the nation. Please contact me if you have any additional questions or comments about our work in Congress.


