All of the Tarheel Chapter members by now should be aware that on August 1st, the Tarheel Chapter will shutdown. Notification of this was sent either by email to those chapter members having an email address or a letter for those members with only a mailing address.

The Tarheel Chapter was chartered on August 1, 1973 and has successfully been carrying out the USSV-WWII's organizational mission "To perpetuate the memory of those shipmates who gave their lives in submarine warfare" throughout North Carolina. The chapter completed its assigned project to establish a memorial for the USS S-28 (SS 133) with the dedication of a memorial located in Wilmington on May 5, 2007. This chapter also provided the foundation for the first USSVI base in the state (Tarheel Base) that many of the chapter members became members of this base when it started in September 1997. We now have 4 bases in North Carolina with a fifth starting in less than a month. So the mission started in this state by the Tarheel Chapter will continue on with the state's USSVI bases.

REMEMBERING THE S-28

Lost on July 4, 1944



The U.S. Submarine Veterans of World War II Assigned USS S-28 (SS-133) to the State of North Carolina



The official memorial to USS S-28 (SS 133) is located in Riverside Park adjacent to the Battleship USS North Carolina (BB 55) in Wilmington, NC. It was dedicated by the NC Submarine Veterans in May 2007.



The S-28 was lost with 50 crew members while conducting training exercises off Hawaii with the US Coast Guard Cutter Reliance. After S-28 dove for a practice torpedo approach, Reliance lost contact. No distress signal or explosion was heard. Two days later, an oil slick was found near where S-28. The exact cause of her loss remains a mystery.

Both the Subvets and our wives posed for the traditional pictures taken at the memorial. We also conducted the "Tolling of the Boats" for the 52 submarines lost during WWII. Harold Steed was the only WWII Subvet able to attend this year.







Saturday evening after the buffet dinner, Steve Bell presented Tony with an Honorary Submariner Award from the Carolina-Piedmont Base. From the NC Subvets, Tony received a check for \$2,000.00, to help defray his costs of the recent repairs, were the proceeds from several fund raising activities conducted over the past couple of years as well as a very generous \$500.00 donation from Tarheel Base Member Joe Peek. Joe's donation was in memory of his father who was also a submariner. Additionally, Tony also received a Citation from the NC Subvets recognizing "his concern, dedicated efforts and generous financial support in the preservation, restoration and beautification of the WWII Submarine Memorial located on his property" as well as a framed picture of the USS North Carolina (SSN 777).

Shipmates and loved ones,

FREEDOM

As a Chaplain; as an American and as a Christian, I respect all faiths and the freedom for anyone to worship or not worship as they please. Under the U.S. Constitution that is the freedom of every citizen of the United States of America. However, as a follower of Christ, I am compelled to talk about Jesus and the Bible, the Word of God. I only wish to be a humble messenger for Him and His glory. If the Word of God offends you then take it up with God.

Jesus said,"Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you <u>free</u>." ³⁴Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. ³⁶So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. John 8:32, 34, 36 (NIV).

Free to Choose!

Freedom! God is really, really big on Freedom! Although God is Sovereign – that is, he controls all things and he can do anything he wants . . . anytime . . . he has given you and me the freedom to choose. Individual freedom is a gift from God,

<u>not</u> the government. In the book of Genesis God told Adam and Eve they were **FREE** to eat from **ANY** tree in the Garden (Genesis 2:16) except from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. If they ate from that they would die. They were free to eat it, but if they did, they would suffer the consequences because its fruit was not good for them. They were free to choose. **They chose!**

Today, I believe, America is at a critical crossroads. Just as God presented His people in Deuteronomy 28 with a list of blessings and curses, I believe he has presented us with those same choices today.

Deuteronomy 30:19-20 (NIV) This day I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live ²⁰ and that you may love the LORD your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the LORD is your life . . .

We rode in submarines that defied the power of gravity which would pull them to the bottom if it could. We fly airplanes and put astronauts in space by defying the power of gravity. But gravity is still there. If you don't believe it just jump off a tall building without a parachute and see where you land! When God created all things he set in motion a natural order. Smoke rises (lighter than air) and objects fall (heavier than air).

I want my children and grandchildren to live FREE and I believe you do too. But whether our children will live in freedom or in slavery depends on the choices we make today.

I have a "Cold War" patch on my USSVI vest. It represents the years of the "Cold War" between America and Communism (Russia, in particular). I remember sleepless nights and days, drilling at sea for possible action. I

remember when the United States Government took a staunch stand against the encroachment of socialism around the world which threatened our existence as a free country. We considered Communism to be an enemy to our sovereignty and freedom. Not only are communism, socialism, Marxism and a lot of other isms anti-American, they are also anti-Christian. Perhaps I should say it differently; the Bible is anti-ism in whatever form it may come.

Your political leanings are important of course. But, if you are a follower of Christ and believe in the freedom of the individual, you must take a stand against those who want to move this nation towards more and more socialism – which I believe results in "Shared misery," poverty and death! I urge you to be prepared to vote intelligently in November!

If we continue on this path that is contrary to God's designed order, we will experience discord and pain and who knows what grief and sorrow our children and grandchildren will experience. The "borrower is slave to the lender." God has ordained that life functions in specific ways. Take time to read Deuteronomy 30 and see the blessings that come upon a nation when they obey and the curses (consequences) when they don't.

2 Chronicles 7:13-:14 (NIV) If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

This, of course, was spoken to the people of Israel but I believe God's principles apply to all generations and to all people and nations. The answer to our problems is not the Government! President Reagan said that, "Government is the problem." The answer is a moral and ethical people who are obey God's law.

We can turn to other gods – socialism, Marxism, communism, bigger government or whatever, but they will not and cannot solve our problems or needs. Only freedom and the responsibility that comes with it can rescue this nation from utter destruction.

Sin blinds us to the goodness of God (Isaiah 59:2). Sin also puts us in bondage (1 Timothy 2:26).

Jesus said: **Luke 4:18(NIV)** "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim <u>freedom</u> for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to <u>release</u> the oppressed,

And the Apostle Paul writes:

Galatians 5:1(NIV) It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

However, true freedom is not trusting ourselves or the government, but in trusting the Lord. We often talk about love. The love chapter in the Bible is 1 Corinthians 13. Verse 7 is amazing:

1 Corinthians 13:7(NIV) It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Prior to the working meeting, a number of Subvets enjoyed a lunch get together at the Golden Corral in Cary.



FROM THE TARHEEL BASE CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS

Section 1: ELECTED OFFICERS

- A. Elected Base officers will be Commander, Vice-Commander, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- B. The term of office for all Base officers will be one (1) year or until their successors have been elected.
- C. Nominations and election of next year's Base officers will occur in the fourth quarter of each year. Any regular member may nominate another regular member for any elected office. It is the responsibility of the member who is nominating another member for any elected office to get the concurrence of that potential nominee that the nominee will accept the office if elected.
- D. All Base officers may succeed themselves.
- E. The term of office for elected Base officers will begin immediately after being sworn in.

Section 2: APPOINTED OFFICERS

- A. Appointed Base officers will include, but not be limited to: USSV-WWII State Commander, Chaplain, Membership Chairman, Holland Club Coordinator, Historian, Webmaster, Storekeeper, Public Relations Officer, Eagle Scout Award Coordinator, Chief of the Boat (COB), and Lost Boat Liaison.
- B. Regular members being appointed must have the approval of the majority of the elected Base officers. Their continuance in their appointed office must be approved each year by the newly elected Base officers.
- C. The term of office for all appointed Base officers will be until their successors are appointed.
- D. All appointed Base officers may be reappointed.
- E. The term of office for appointed Base officers will begin immediately after their appointment.

ARTICLE X - VOTING

<u>Section 1</u>: Each member in good standing shall be entitled to vote in person at any regular or working Base meeting. The only exception is the election of Base Officers where the use of an email or mail-in ballot is allowed.

<u>Section 2</u>: There shall be no voting by proxy or by absentee ballot; any member in good standing not voting will be considered abstaining.

FROM THE TARHEEL BASE BYLAWS

ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL ELECTIONS

Election of Base Officers will be held during the month of October of each year using an email ballot. Those Base members without email will have this ballot mailed to them using the US Postal System. All ballots will be returned to the designated "Election Master" for counting using either the internet or postal system. A simple majority of the votes from the ballots returned will be used to determine the winning candidate for each elected office.

Once again we've been left high in drydock. The legislature has adjourned. Please see the bottom-most note below and read upwards.

I can't tell you how many notes I've gotten in the past few weeks stating, "We'll get it", "we'll get there", "the issue will be resolved before adjournment", etc. I went down to the legislature and folks say "We're working on it." I just had a bad feeling when I learned that the S116 Bill was still stuck in the House Finance Committee. There are approximately 22 plates in that bill. I've suggested to Rep. Gibson that ours and possibly any other military related plates be done in his "new bill."





FYI, Rep. Gibson is one of the Chairmen of the House Finance Committee and the person I've been working with. If you feel the need to send any notes to the Finance Committee members, I've attached their names and contact information on the next page. Rep. Gibson sent a note to me that ... "He will take care of it" ... as much as I'm upset (not really the word I wanted to use), I think we need to be careful in any notes to him and other Finance members so as not to "p--- them off" on the Subvets. Gibson is a powerful person in the House.

What upsets me most is a NASCAR plate for Danica Patrick (lives in Phoenix, AZ), no ties to NC, was released just a couple months ago and NASCAR also has a Juan Pablo Montoya (Columbia, South America citizen) plate. Maybe if the Subvets had the \$\$\$ that NASCAR has, we'd have the plate by now.

I never imagined something that costs the State virtually nothing would be so hard to get. For everyone's info, I have 264 names wanting 383 plates so we're well over the 300 mark they require. I know for a fact that some of the plates that were approved in the past, sit in a DMV file waiting for the respective organization to come up with the 300 required and this is a "rub" with the legislature. I've let our lawmakers know the above numbers and that ours would not sit very long in a DMV file.

My sincere apologies to you all that it will take us more time than we expected.

Please see below for a message from Torsk Volunteer Association Chairman Mike Eacho concerning the Fall 2010 Torsk Work Weekend: I have gone in the past with Don Morton (deceased member of Tarheel Base) and had a blast. You can sleep in crew's berthing... take the grandkids too... Charlie Cross and his son Jeff attend each year... be sure to your name in early!

Greetings Crew.

The annual Torsk Work Weekend will occur this year on October 1-3 (Friday-Sunday). This year there will be a number of changes to the Work Weekend routine. The Museum will not financially support the meals this year. In addition to the Friday evening meal, which the Torsk Volunteer Association has funded and prepared for the last several years, the TVA is going to have to fund breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday. The Museum had a bad year last year, and because of the nasty winter we had, their revenue for this year is already very low compared to previous years. Also because revenue is low this year, they will not allow us to use the Taney at all this year for berthing or meals. They plan to book overnighters aboard Taney that weekend and cannot have us aboard. They have agreed to not use Torsk for overnight programs that weekend to allow us to hold our annual work WWE. Overnight programs provide a good deal of the museum's annual revenue.

So, here are the changes we will have to make under the circumstances to enable us to still have a productive and fun WWE.

- 1. All berthing for males will be aboard Torsk. There are 30 berths available in Crew's berthing and Crew's Head is functional.
- 2. Berthing for females will be aboard Chesapeake. Seven berths are available, four are already spoken for, and Chesapeake's head is functional.
- 3. Berthing is on a first-come-first-serve basis, as always.
- 4. Showers will be available on Chesapeake and Torsk after the boat closes to the public. There may also be showers available at the Aquarium, but that's not for certain at this time.
- 5. Meals will be served aboard Chesapeake with the exception of Saturday evening and Sunday morning.
- 6. Saturday evening's meal will be a deck party / cookout topside aboard Torsk (weather permitting).
- 7. Continental breakfast on Sunday will be in Crew's Mess aboard Torsk.
- 8. Only people who make reservations in advance can be accommodated.
- 9. We are asking for a \$20 donation from each attendee to help TVA fund meals, beer, sodas, ice, etc. This is not mandatory and it won't completely cover TVA's cost, but it sure will help. TVA has very shallow pockets.



Online Voting Instructions


- Go to the USSVI website HTTP:// ussvi.org and click on the VOTE BUTTON on the page.
- You will than be presented with the Member login page.



If you are voting for the first time you go to the Voting page and if you are trying to vote twice you will be given an error page stating that you are trying to vote twice or are an invalid voter.

The Online System has built in security to check to see that no associate members can vote and you cannot vote twice by voting online and than sending in a paper ballot. For those of you who do not have a computer you can use a shipmate's computer to login on the system or mail in a paper ballot to the Election Master. This online system was set up so you the member have total control and secrecy in his voting. The Base Commander is out of the loop and it is just you and the computer or you and the paper ballot.

After you sign and are cleared to vote you will be presented with the Voting page.



To vote you click in the circle next to the Yes/No or the name of the candidate. If you do not like any of the candidates you can write a name in the other box under the candidate's name.

In the upper left corner of the page above the **menu button** you click on your region so that the correct regional director voting box appears in the lower right corner of the ballot. **You can only vote in the Region of your primary base.**

In each of the areas of the ballot you will see a **View Button**. By clicking on this button you will get a dialog box containing information on that subject. If you **view** a candidate you get his bio, if you **view** the changes you get info on what that change does or where to go for more details. The American Submariner issue #2 has the candidate's bios, issue 3# has all the Proposed Changes to the C&Bs and why they were made and what the E-BOD recommends.

Double check your ballot to see that you have made all your choices and than click the **Submit**Your Ballot Button at the bottom of the ballot page. When you click this button your ballot will be tallied in the system and you will be logged out of the voting page. Remember your vote is your voice in USSVI. VOTE IN 2010!

Voting with the Paper Ballot

For those of you who will not vote online you can vote using the paper ballot included in the American Submariner. You can also request a ballot form the National Secretary or have a shipmate print one for you from the USSVI website. The American Submariner issue #2 has the candidate's bios, issue 3# has all the Proposed Changes and why they were made, and the E-BOD recommends. Also included for your use is a self addressed return envelope to put your ballot in. All you have to do is vote using the included ballot, sign it at the bottom, put it into the included envelope, and put your name, your address and a stamp on it. Put it into the mail box and the Election master will enter your ballot into the online system. All paper ballots will be retained until the end of the year and destroyed as in the past. Again remember your vote is your voice in USSVI. Vote in 2010!

MEMORIAL PRE-REGISTRATION FEES (\$12) pay for the general memorial expenses. Such as the pre-registration form mailout, memorial wreath, rental expenses, phone calls, postage, various buffets, entertainment, the hospitality room & Goat Locker expenses to name some items. Those who DON'T PRE-REGISTER WITH ME are on your own for transportation, subase access, CAN'T submit for SSBN tours or OFFICIAL DINNER at the Clubs of Kings Bay. DINNER PRE-REGISTRATION (\$31) FEES pays for the caterer & dinner (incl tax&tip) (**\$20**); the Clubs of Kings Bay rental fee (**\$10**); and those other little unplanned expenses (**\$1**). I must have registration forms prior to 12 Oct. Reunion coordinators are requested to work with museum manager during the summer for local information to assist your plans. <u>Group schedule tours on SSBN are not possible</u>, but I will try to work things out.
